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Investigation Guidelines Foreign Travel Reporting Threat Awareness

NEW INVESTIGATION GUIDELINES

Timeframes for periodic investigations have changed. Anyone with a clearance will be required to undergo a new investigation every five years. The date is based on the last investigation date or enrollment date in continuous evaluation, whichever is later. Here are three key points:

- Periodic reinvestigations will not be conducted for the NISP contractor national security population.
- An updated SF-86 (e-QIP and releases) will need to be submitted every 5 years, regardless of level of eligibility.
- An individual enrolled in CV, regardless of reason (Other/Deferred) is compliant with the Continuous Vetting requirements.

SENIOR MANAGEMENT THREAT AWARENESS

SEAD 3 requires the active involvement of senior management in your security program. FSOs should regularly meet with senior management officials to brief them on threat vectors.
